Resignation It was noted that Ann Bryan resigned due to the extensive work that her gardening business required. Her participation on the commission is appreciated.

Approval of Minutes: The March and April meeting minutes were approved.

OLD BUSINESS

Procedure Change Due to the requirements of the Open Meetings Law, email votes will not be used.

Water chestnut and Milfoil Harvesting Removal of Water chestnuts and Eurasian Milfoil from the creek around the village beach was discussed. Reaching out to community groups for volunteers was proposed. June 23 at 10:00 am was decided as an appropriate date for the hand pulling of the vegetation. Skip, Mike H. Mary and Carole volunteered to participate. Skip volunteered to scope the area and ask Gail Porter to accompany him in order to create an implementation plan for the project. It was suggested that Councilman Schoonmaker be asked to participate. The importance of preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species was stressed.

NYS law requires signage at boat launches instructing boaters on cleaning boats to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Bristol Beach Update The Bristol Beach Report was presented. Additional time is needed to review the report. Goal 1. 1 in Table 1.1 was approved. Mike H stated that the Bristol Beach Advisory Committee recommended that the main public entrance should be from 9W.

Planning Board Report Mary Anne reported on matters before the Planning Board. No matters required CAC attention.

NEW BUSINESS

New York State Draft Invasive Species Comprehensive Management Plan

Leslie, having reviewed the draft plan, presented her comments which were discussed and accepted. It was suggested that in addition to her recommended comments, an additional comment be added regarding the need for the plan to further address the issue of removal of aquatic invasive species and provide resources to municipalities for removal efforts. The Town Board will be advised that the CAC will present the comments to the NYSDEC.

Watershed Management Plan Advisory Group. Tabled

Rt 212/Rt. 32 Revitalization Patrick and Vernon reported on the recent Community Forum. No action was recommended at this time.

Town Board Liaison Report Mike M reported that the County Climate Smart Committee was impressed with the progress being made by the CAC Climate Smart Task Force. He suggested that wind power could be explored as an alternative source of energy for one point toward certification. The link, https://nysolarmap.com, is a good resource for determining where in NYS there are good locations to site solar farms.
